

Kooljaman At Cape Leveque



Kooljaman at Cape Leveque is a wilderness style luxury camp which is surrounded by a diversity of natural wonders. The amazing wildlife, the vast array of marine life and a stunning coastline which allows unrestricted views of magnificent sunrises and sunsets, makes this a truly unique experience.

Kooljaman is the Bardi Aboriginal name for the land at the tip of the Dampier Peninsula north of Broome. The two surrounding indigenous communities of Djarindjin and One Arm Point jointly own Kooljaman and have developed the facility in line with the community's aspirations and their inherent knowledge of the land. Kooljaman at Cape Leveque has been established for 20 years and has won numerous state tourism awards and recently won four Australian Tourism Awards.



ACCOMMODATION

Kooljaman at Cape Leveque has a variety of accommodation and has been designed to capture the rugged natural character of the Kimberley region. There are 14 safari tents, 2 en-suite cabins, 4 log cabins, 3 campground units, 7 dome tents, 11 beach shelters and 23 campsites. Check in time 2pm and Check out time 10am.

Safari Tents

These stunning tents are built on the hillside nestled below the lighthouse with unrestricted views around the bay. All of the Safari Tents sleep four people with one queen bed and two single beds. Each tent has its own large balcony with timber dining setting, a private bathroom, quality fixtures & fittings, full size fridge/freezer, all cooking equipment, linen and a gourmet gas barbecue on the veranda.

Ensuite Cabins

Set just back from the beach in a secluded bush setting, each cabin has one queen bed and three single beds along with a private toilet & shower. Each cabin has its own timber dining setting, a private bathroom, full size fridge/freezer, all cooking equipment, linen and a gas barbecue on the veranda.

Log Cabins

These charming cabins are made from bush poles with a tin roof and opening shutters with toilet/shower facilities being shared between two cabins. Each cabin has one queen and two singles beds and feature open construction, some have ocean views. They have all of the facilities as listed above for the ensuite cabins with the exception of the private toilet & shower.

Units

The units are located in the campground each unit has one queen bed & two single beds. Each Unit has its own dining setting, full size fridge/freezer, all cooking equipment, linen and a gas barbecue on the veranda.

Ablution facilities are located next door and shared with the campground.

Mini Safari Tents

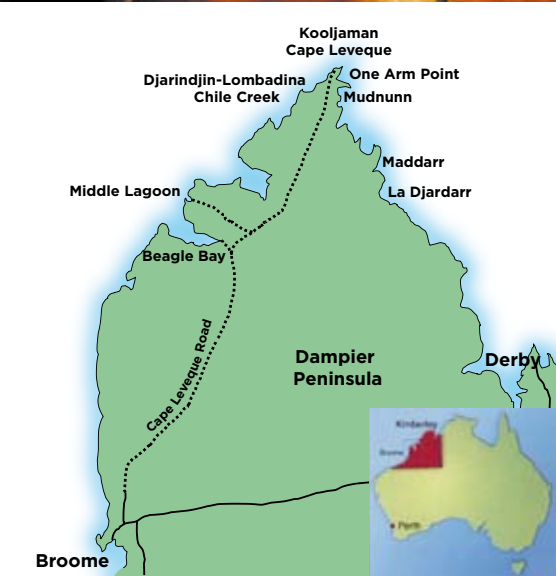
The Mini Safari Tents are located in the campground. Each sleeps up to two people and contains a comfortable futon style bed (twin or double), fan & light. There is a small balcony with shade and chairs. Gas barbecues and ablutions are located in the campground. BYO Linen or hire linen is available.

Beach Camping Shelters

The beach shelters are located on the beach front close to the water's edge and are made from bush poles with a thatched roof and palm frond walls and a sand floor. Each shelter has a picnic table, open fresh water shower and a wood barbecue. Shared ablution facilities are located nearby.

Campground

There are 23 powered & unpowered sites located in a grassed area with some shade cover and share wood barbecue's are situated throughout the campsite. Ablutions, BBQ's and laundry facilities are located nearby.



LOCATION & GETTING HERE

Covering 10 hectares Kooljaman is located 220kms north of Broome on the tip of the Dampier Peninsula. Access is either by air or by 4WD. The drive up takes approximately 3 hours, and the road can be corrugated but well worth the effort once you reach us. Kooljaman also has a private airstrip on site.

- Regular flights are available from Broome.
- Regular road transfers and day tour operators are available daily.



ACTIVITIES

Kooljaman at Cape Leveque offers a diverse range of nature based activities; guests can enjoy snorkelling with a beautiful array of tropical fish life, swimming in crystal clear blue waters, fishing, photography, beachcombing for unique shells, mud crabbing, learning about bush tucker, scenic flights over the Buccaneer Archipelago, charter boat trips, whale watching, bird spotting or the most popular activity of all - doing nothing but soaking up the sheer tranquillity and beauty of the surrounds

Restaurant & Cafe

The restaurant overlooks Kooljaman's Western Beach with delightful views from the Alfresco dining area. From April to October the restaurant is open for lunch daily and evening meals are served daily (subject to minimum numbers). If the restaurant is closed we offer a delightful meals service called our Bush Butler (see below).

Takeaway lunches are available.

We do not sell alcohol at Kooljaman though you are most welcome to bring your own. Children's meals are available and special dietary requirements can usually be catered for by prearrangement.

Bush Butler

For guests wanting to enjoy the beautiful serenity and views from their private balcony, we offer a 'Bush Butler' service. Gourmet BBQ dinners are prepared in our restaurant including premium cuts of meat or fish, salads, garlic bread & condiments. These are collected from the restaurant to cook up on their BBQ when ready to dine. Self catering full or continental breakfast baskets are also available.

General Store

We have a small general store, which has basic items available, such as barbecue packs, frozen bread, ice creams, UHT milk, ice, bait and some canned goods. It is worthwhile to note that no fresh fruit or vegetables are available for sale.

Kooljaman Cultural Scenic Glass Bottom Boat Tour

Explore the beautiful waters and coastlines of Cape Leveque with a local guide. Kooljaman's new 9 metre glass bottom boat with a full canopy is available for 2 hour boat trips. The boat trip will include some of the following activities; View the magnificent fish, coral and sea life around the inshore reefs, observe Humpback whales on the journey to breeding grounds 200km North of Cape Leveque, explore the estuary and bird life of Hunters Creek, explore secluded beaches and beach comb for shells and learn about the local Bardi culture and traditions.

The day's activities will depend on tides and the time of year. Minimum numbers are required and advance bookings are recommended.

Scenic Flights

Scenic flights over the magnificent Buccaneer Archipelago and horizontal waterfalls are available from Kooljaman. The flight depart Kooljaman airstrip and you have the chance to see the lighthouse and beaches from the air as you head out past Hunters Creek. You will witness the huge tidal movements, the numerous Island of the Archipelago, the pearl farms and the famous Horizontal waterfalls. Flights are available most days on request, subject to minimum numbers.

Services and activities are subject to change without notice.

Mud Crabbing

The Peninsula's Mangroves and mudflats are home to the sought after mud crab. You are able to join a local guide in a mud crabbing adventure through the mangroves & mudflats. The guides will show you how to locate and catch mud crabs using a hook. Own transport is needed to meet with your local guide.

Cultural Tours

We have a pool of local aboriginal guides who offer a wide range of tours. These are not always structured tours and are available very much on a day to day basis and can be arranged through our office or directly with the guides.

Hunters Creek Tagalong Cultural Tour

Hunters Creek Tagalong Tour offers half day tours departing Kooljaman in the comfort of your own vehicle.

Follow Brian along the beautiful Eastern beach, over sand dunes to stunning Hunters Creek, an area that is normally off limits to the general public.

During the tour learn about the natural landscape and the history of the Hunters. Enjoy a swim or try your hand at spear fishing. Maybe catch a mud crab.

A tour the whole family will enjoy. Minimum numbers are required.
